Analysis	Design Investigate Contrast	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Design your own information poster about the Victorian era. • Victorians loved symmetry. Investigate and design/make a Victorian garden. • Research Victorian houses from 1837. Make a Victorian house and compare it to houses now 	5
Evaluation	Judge Discuss Debate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss your learning about the Victorian era with a family member- can you teach them any new facts? Write a report on what you have taught them. • Write a letter to a Victorian child telling them what it is like living in Southport in 2020. 	8
Synthesis	Create Invent Imagine	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Imagine you are a Victorian child. Write a diary account of what it is like in a workhouse. • Create a shoebox scene of a Victorian house. • Bake a recipe from a Victorian kitchen, (english-heritage.org.uk) this website will give you some ideas.
